





Airport Master Plan Update

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What is an Airport Master Plan?

Federally required document to help an airport:

- Plan strategically for the future while preserving flexibility for changing conditions
- Identify new projects to support long-term growth and safety



It is **ALSO** the City's plan for how PSP intends to meet regulatory requirements and growth, and what funding requests PSP will make to the FAA over time.



The Master Plan Does Not Evaluate

- Architectural design or specific design elements
- Other infrastructure design (ex: WiFi, most utilities, regional transit routes)
- Strategic or business plans
- The above are examined thru various other studies or programs



This is only a plan. Each major project identified in the master plan will have to be separately approved, funded, and comply with state and federal environmental requirements.









Figure 6-25: Conceptual Development Plan





What Happens After Master Plan Adoption?

- Airport staff determines:
 - Which projects on the master plan to pursue first
 - What activity level will trigger the need for that project
- Airport staff determines a funding strategy for **each** project based on market/business conditions at the time the project is initiated
- Airport staff works with consultant to draft basis of design and project definition report. THIS is where we start to get into details about individual project (scale, design, costs, etc.)
- Airport staff goes thru iterative consultation process with Airport Commission, City Council and Community on specific design elements leading to 100% design for construction



Why We Need an Airport Master Plan

Planning now to meet future demand.

The Palm Springs International Airport is the gateway to the Coachella Valley. It needs to plan for the future in order to:

- Preserve iconic elements of the airport
- Create better passenger experience
- Accommodate for future growth
- Comply with latest airport safety requirements
- Begin new sustainability initiatives

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Delivering the Flexibility We Need


- Create customs and border patrol to accept **international flights**
 - From areas such as, Mexico, Canada, and Europe
- Increase capacity of baggage claim for faster processing of checked bags
- Increase gate capacity
- Increase **space** in terminals; more seats, more space to spread out
- Improve rent a car experience


Economic Impact of a Tourist

Parking needs today versus 2042.










Figure 4-10: Alternative 1A Phase 2

Sustainability is at the Heart of the Master Plan

Improved efficiencies will minimize the use of resources.



- The Airport Master Plan will align with existing City sustainability policies
- Use of solar for electricity generation
- Infrastructure improvements to support aircraft, electric vehicles, and public transit
- Roadway and taxiway improvements to minimize emissions
- Continuing resource-saving efforts like low-water landscaping and recycling programs



Mitigating Airplane Noise

Minimizing impact and being a responsible community member.



- 1. Airport Noise and Capacity Act of 1990: Prevents all US airports from imposing restrictions on flight schedules, number of flights or noise limits
- 2. More Quiet, Modern Aircraft: Airplane manufacturers are building quieter planes
- **3. Encouraging 'Good Neighbor' Practices:** We work closely with our military partners, asking them to voluntarily adjust their operations to reduce noise.

How Airports Are Funded

PSP does not use local taxes.

The airport and its major projects are funded by airport revenues, user fees, and federal grants.

Every cup of coffee, airline ticket, and rental car sold at the airport funds PSP and its projects.

The airport does not rely on local taxes to operate.
